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CLYA COLLEGE TOUR 2020

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What schools are we visiting? Norfolk State, Old Dominion University, Hampton University, University of Richmond, Virginia Union, Virginia Commonwealth University and Virginia State

When are we leaving? Everyone attending the tour will need to be at the ARC on Sunday, April 5, 2020 between 2pm - 2:15pm (time might change). **Please eat lunch before arriving to the ARC.** (Association Resource Center / 801 Corporate Center Dr. / Raleigh, NC 27607)

When are you returning? We will be back on Friday, April 10, 2020 between 7:30pm - 8:30pm (time might change) Teens will be instructed to communicate with their parents.

What should my child bring on the trip?

- Each teen will need spending money for at least 3 meals and any souvenirs he/she wants to purchase during tours, mall or amusement park
- Comfortable clothing, walking shoes, and a jacket/coat (appropriate AND in line with dress code policy)
- Personal Toiletries
- Preferably a maximum of two bags per person (teens will be responsible for carrying their own luggage to and from the bus)
- Any other personal items that are needed for the week

What items should my child NOT bring on the tour? Excessive amounts of money, gaming consoles, expensive items, etc. **The Y will not be responsible for any lost or stolen items.**

Are meals provided? A full breakfast will be available at the hotel. We have arranged and paid to have lunch in the cafeterias on the college campuses. Dinner and lunch will be covered everyday EXCEPT on Wednesday night, April 8, Friday lunch, April 10, food at an amusement park and maybe another night that is not listed.

What are the sleeping arrangements? Each room will have 4 people to a room with 2 queen beds. There will be no co-habitation of the opposite sexes in rooms for any reason.

Will room checks be conducted nightly? Rooms checks will be done each night at curfew (11:30pm). At which point, teens will not be allowed out of their room for any reason unless given permission by an adult chaperone on the trip.

How should the teens prepare for the trip? Each teen is responsible for researching the basic information for each school, creating a list of 10 questions to ask university admissions reps, and journaling their experience of each school after each tour.

What if my child needs to take medication? Make sure you fill out a medication form and submit to Kendall or Whykeshia. Please make sure that it is communicated to directors / adults that your child will need their medications.
